The path to understanding inclusion leads through information, information ideally received through experience. The aim of the Changing Our Story summer schools is therefore to familiarise students who collaborate on the project with the typical problems and challenges of the society of the country where the summer school takes place since those can act as frequent factors of exclusion of an individual or even whole group of people.

The second summer school organised within the project took place in Pilsen and the local University of West Bohemia. The students from partner universities in Slovakia and the Netherlands were introduced to the topics of mental health and illness, which represent a growing problem as well as persistent stigma, social exclusion and the closely related problems of over-indebtedness or child debt, the overlooked issue of homelessness or the current topic of integration and coexistence with high number of newly arrived Ukranian refugees.

Students were invited to portray their experiences and impressions in the form of photographs and visual art on the theme of inclusion in the Fresh Air Gallery in Pilsen, where their creations were accessible to hundreds of people who walk through this place every day. They then freely recorded their thoughts in self-made diaries, which are an integral part of this zine.



































## A TRIP TO PRAGUE

## LET THE WALL SPEAK








### INCLUSIVE


